
## Earn a yard sign with two simple steps:

## Additional Conservation@Home Ideas for Your Yard:

- Diversity helps! Densely plant different types of native plants to support a diversity of life. Don't forget about the sedges, grasses, trees and shrubs too!
- Allow plant stems and leaves to remain in gardens over winter. Insects use them and birds eat the seeds.
- Let the rain soak in! Direct downspouts to planted areas, or use a rain barrel if it's right for your yard.
- Lawn care: Mow no shorter than 3 inches and minimize fertilizer/herbicide use. Consider converting unused lawn areas to native plant habitat.
- Encourage your neighbors to adopt these ideas!
